

The book has Keneesha, a secret service agent introduce the White House. The information gets confusing, especially since it does not follow any chronological order. President Taft and Franklin Roosevelt are on the same page. Lincoln is mentioned 2 pages later. At least the author is preparing for a woman president because she mentions the first lady or the first gentleman. This book does have a lot of good information.
